My name is Clif Marsiglio. I am representing NESCO, the Near East Side Community Organization, and its nearly 33,000 people are united in our firm opposition to Indiana Senate Bill 52.

Today, I want to talk about the transformative power of dedicated lanes and their positive impact on my community.

The heart of this matter lies in the **Bus Rapid Transit** (BRT) project and its potential hope for blighted areas. It's not just about public transit; it's about revitalizing neighborhoods, creating opportunities, and sparking economic change for the better.
